## **Rural Crime Survey 2020 North Yorkshire Police**



- 96% of those surveyed think crime is significant in their community
  - o 32% very significant
  - o 36% quite significant
  - o 28% somewhat significant
- 70% think crime has increased in the last 12 months
- 35% of people have had a crime committed against them in the last 12 months and the top 6 rural crimes reported were
  - Wildlife crime or hare poaching 52%
  - Theft of agricultural machinery or equipment— 39%
  - o Animal rights activism 34%
  - Theft from an outbuilding 33%
  - Trespass 31%
  - Fly-tipping 31%
- 17% of those crimes were not reported to the police due to
  - o 45% thought it would be a waste of time / there would be no point
  - o 45% thought the police couldn't have done anything
  - o 27% thought it was too trivial / not worth reporting
- 51% of those who reported crimes were dissatisfied with the police response
- The crimes which police should be tackling in rural communities in order of priority are:
  - 1. Agricultural machinery theft
  - 2. Livestock rustling
  - 3. Fly-tipping
  - 4. Poaching deer and hare
- 42% of people had installed crime prevention measures in the last 12 months due to an increased fear of crime (62%) and being a victim of crime (36%)
  - o 71% security lighting
  - o 70% vehicles locked and keys secured when not in use
  - 58% lock personal items away
- 47% of people don't think the police take rural crime seriously
- 50% of people don't think rural policing has improved since Police and Crime Commissioners were introduced in 2012
- 61% of people rate the police as 'good' or 'excellent' in their area
